### Operate an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) 700123D1

<b>Performance</b>	Activate and apply an AED on a patient with a shockable rhythm, whilst undertaking single-rescuer CPR.
<b>Standards</b>	In accordance with manufacturers operating instructions.
<b>Conditions</b>	Using a AED trainer on a manikin (adult, child or infant).
<b>Comments</b>	

### Provide basic life support (CPR) for adult, children and infants. 700123D2

<b>Performance</b>	Perform single-rescuer CPR without adjuncts
<b>Standards</b>	For at least 2 minutes, in accordance with good practices and approved references set by recognised international, national or state bodies.
<b>Conditions</b>	On an adult, child and infant manikin, with no adjuncts other than optional face-shield.
<b>Comments</b>	Must also include managing foreign body airway obstruction for adult, child and infant (i.e. thrusts/blows). Must demonstrate placing patient into the recovery position.

### Assess and treat major hemorrhage 700123D3

<b>Performance</b>	Assess and provide basic initial treatment of patient with major hemorrhage and shock as a first aider
<b>Standards</b>	In accordance with good first aid practices set by a recognised international, national or state body.
<b>Conditions</b>	For a major hemorrhage caused by one of the following: gunshot, impalement, stabbing, crush injury.
<b>Comments</b>	Must demonstrate knowledge of indications and contra-indications of using tourniquet.

<b>Demonstrate professional practices as a first aider</b>	<b>700123D4</b>
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Performance	Provide first aid in a professional, safe and respectful manner, through obtaining consent (where possible), treating patient information in confidence, safeguarding (child protection), documenting treatment, critical thinking/problem solving, and reviewing first aid response.
Standards	In accordance with any codes applicable, local privacy obligations, cultural practices and organizational reporting requirements.
Conditions	In a simulated emergency incident requiring engagement with patient, bystanders and emergency services.
Comments	Where "Good Samaritan" or "duty to act" laws exist, an awareness of these should be demonstrated. Safety refers to safety of first aider, patient and others at the scene. An awareness of available telehealth services should be demonstrated where appropriate.

<b>Assess and treat limited range of trauma and medical conditions</b>	<b>700223D1</b>
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Performance	Assess and treat a patient with two trauma and two medical conditions (see comments).
Standards	In accordance with good first aid practices set by a recognised international, national or state body.
Conditions	Appropriate resources must be supplied to enable candidate to assess and treat patient in accordance with approved references.
Comments	Trauma may include, but not limited to: fractures, dislocations, spinal injury, crush injury, poisoning. Medical may include but not limited to: heart attack, hypothermia, hyperthermia, asthma, stroke, diabetes, seizure. Minor injuries should as small cuts, grazes, bruises, minor burns/scalds and small splinters must be integrated to the trauma condition, but given secondary importance for treatment.
